

About the artist:

Rosalie GASCOIGNE (1917 – 1999) was a New Zealand-Australian sculptor. GASCOIGNE is best known for her assemblages of found objects. She used materials like weathered wood, scraps of wire, pieces of old tin and sheets of corrugated iron.

Materials:

Scissors Glue Cardboard Pastels

Create:

Create your own assemblage by cutting up a piece of corrugated cardboard into various sized rectangles. Inspired by *Wild strawberries*, think of your favourite fruit, and then colour each of your cut out rectangles differently. Some rectangles may be heavily coloured and some lightly coloured, so that they look like the variations in the fruit skin. Arrange the coloured pieces of cardboard into a rectangle on your cardboard sheet. When you are happy with your work, glue the coloured pieces into place.
